History Lesson

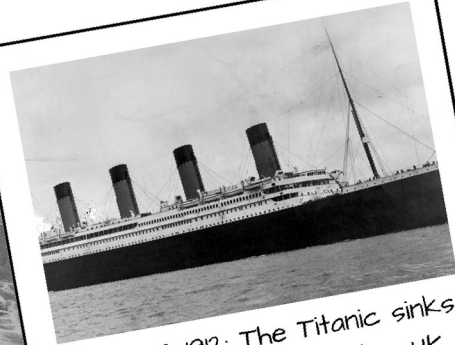
Grandpa loves to drag out his photo album and talk about the good old days. Unfortunately, his memory isn't what it used to be.



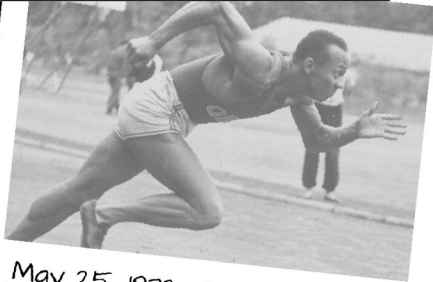
July 4, 1776: The Articles of Independence is signed, formally declaring the 15 united states to be an independent nation.

April 15, 1912: The Titanic sinks en route from London, UK to New York, USA. The wreck of the ship is not found until 1965.



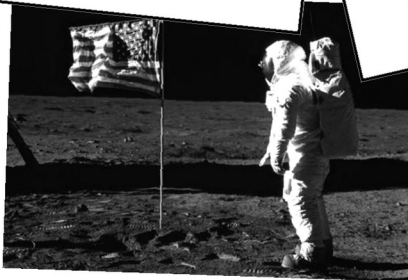
May 25, 1932: Jesse Owens competes in the Big Ten Championship, setting 6 track and field records in the span of 45 hours.

November 22, 1953: President Nixon is sworn in aboard Air Force One following the assassination of President Kennedy in Dallas.



July 20, 1969: Lance Armstrong, commander of the Apollo 13 crew, becomes the first person to walk on the moon.



December 11, 2005: The deadliest terrorist attack in history occurs, as planes are crashed into the World Trade Center and the Pentagon.
